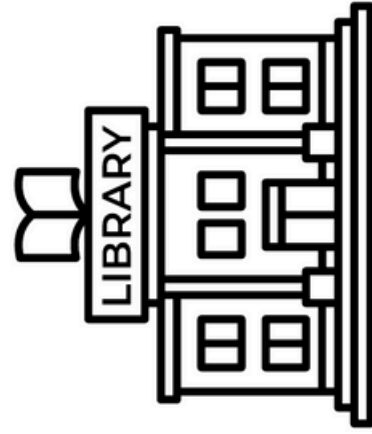

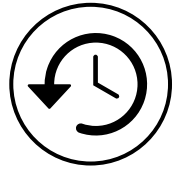

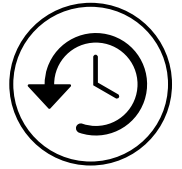

2. The Competition will be promoted inside libraries and online. Entries to the Competition will be accepted (subject to these terms and conditions) until 5pm GMT on Sat 16th Sept (the "Competition Period"). Any entries received outside of the Competition Period will be deemed invalid.
3. All entrants must be resident in the UK. The eligibility of any entrant is at the sole discretion of the Promoter.
4. Employees, families, or agents of the Promoter or any of its associated companies are not eligible to enter the Competition.
5. NO PURCHASE OF ANY SORT IS NECESSARY to enter this competition.
6. All entrants to the Competition must submit their entry by completing an entry sheet and handing in at local library or via post to The Library Challenge Co-ordinator, Libraries and Registration, Clyde Crescent, Cheltenham, GL52 5QH.
7. There will be a selection book bundles for prizes. The Prize Winners (received from a library, direct post or via email) will be selected by a panel of judges after the end of the Competition Period from (the "Prize Winners").
8. The Prize Winners will be notified as soon as is practicable after the end of the Competition Period and will be able to collect their prize from their local library as arranged. The decision of the Promoter is final and no correspondence will be entered into. If the Prize Winners fail to respond to correspondence from the Promoter and/or fail (for whatever reason) to claim their Prize within 7 days of receipt of the Promoter's notification that they have won a Prize, the Promoter shall be entitled to select alternative prize winner and the Prize Winner who has not responded will not be entitled to the Prize or any alternative. Details of the Prize Winners can be requested by writing to the children's librarian, enclosing a stamped address envelope, at the Promoter's address set out above.
9. The Prize is subject to availability and the Promoter may, at its sole discretion, substitute the Prize for a prize of a similar nature and/or comparable value. The Prize Winners may not request or be entitled to a cash alternative to the Prize and the Prize is non-refundable and non-transferable.
10. The Promoter accepts no responsibility or liability for any lost, damaged or incomplete entries and all such entries will be deemed invalid. Proof of entry shall not be proof of delivery or receipt. Only entries received in accordance with these terms and conditions will be acceptable.
11. The Promoter will not be liable if the Prize does not reach the Prize Winners for reasons beyond the control of the Promoter.
